Courses Taught

Transdisciplinary Obesity Prevention Sciences Research Program, Human Development and Family Studies, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (HDFS 494)

Worked with a team of scholars and educators to develop a research methods and childhood obesity prevention course that introduces transdisciplinary research to undergraduate students from multiple disciplines. We employ a flipped or inverted classroom model in which students view lectures outside of class and participate in small group activities during class that challenge them to think critically about the lecture material. Students gain research experience through original research projects and research assistantships with projects sponsored by the Family Resiliency Center. Additionally, students are prepared for the 21st century workforce through professional development lessons.
